Course Synopsis: 2 classes in 1 day!

1. Peeling gums, oral ulcers and burning mouth: Diagnosis and management of vesiculobullous diseases and their “imposters” in the dental patient.

The differential diagnosis for “oral burning” includes several diseases associated with peeling and blistering of the oral mucosa; chronic pain conditions such as idiopathic burning mouth syndrome must also be considered in the differential diagnosis. Dentists and dental hygienists are uniquely qualified to recognize oral lesions associated with vesiculobullous skin diseases such as pemphigus, pemphigoid and lichen planus. Diagnosis and management of these conditions requires a multidisciplinary approach, with dentistry playing a major role. Course participants will learn how to

1. Conduct an appropriate history and physical examination of the head, neck and oral cavity to identify oral signs and symptoms of pemphigus, pemphigoid, lichen planus and other associated conditions.
2. Conduct an appropriate history and physical examination for patients presenting with “oral burning” complaints.
3. Develop a reasonable differential diagnosis for these problems, and
4. Present a management plan which may include additional diagnostic tests, referral to and collaboration with other health professionals, and treatment.

2. The unique role of dentistry in caring for patients with cancer: From prevention and detection to surveillance and supportive care.

Cancer can affect any patient at any age. It is a high likelihood that one or more patients in a dental practice are battling cancer at any given time. Oral health and disease can have serious negative impacts on the patient’s ability to tolerate their cancer treatment and prognosis; cancer therapies can also negatively impact oral health. This course will provide participants with an overview of the impact of cancer and cancer therapy on oral health; the impact of oral disease and infection on cancer therapy and prognosis; and the important role that the dental team plays in supporting our patients undergoing treatment for cancer. The course will provide practical recommendations, and updates on oral complications of newer therapies for common cancers (e.g. antiresorptive therapies, biologic therapies). Course participants will learn how to:

1. Identify patients at risk for cancer, and oral complications of its treatment, including cancers of the head and neck through an appropriate history and physical examination.
2. Recognize signs and symptoms of oral complications of cancer therapy, including those of newer therapies.
4. Understand how to safely and effectively provide dental treatment, before, during and after cancer treatment, including providing supportive care for long term survivors.
5. Comply with guidelines for pain management for dental patients, including new rules for prescribers in the state of Michigan.

Biography: Carol Anne Murdoch-Kinch, DDS PhD FDS RCSEd

Dr. Carol Anne Murdoch-Kinch is the Dr. Walter. H. Swartz Professor of Integrated Special Care Dentistry, Clinical Professor and Associate Dean for Academic Affairs at the University of Michigan School of Dentistry. She is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral Medicine, the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology and a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. She received her DDS from Dalhousie University, and residency training and PhD from Indiana University. For over a decade she ran a hospital- based oral medicine referral clinic at the University of Michigan Hospital, where she conducted clinical research and provided care for patients with oral mucosal disease, salivary gland hypofunction, orofacial pain and oral complications of cancer.
